INDIAN SENIORS WINS SILVER AT 45TH WORLD BRIDGE TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS, ITALY



At the world championships in March /April -2022 the 'SENIOR' TEAM consisting of AshokGoel, Anil Padhye, Rajesh Dallal, Subrto Saha, Sukmal das and Captain & Coach R. Krishnan won the Silver Medal.

This was by far the best performance by any Indian team at the WBC, surpassing the previous Bronze Medal won at Wuhan in 2019.

Brief Summary of BFI Journey:

Dear All Members and Players,

As we have just revived from the jaws of COVID-19, the bridge activities have started unfolding to say the least worldwide. We express our deep gratitude to the overgrowing size of players from West Bengal who have been the strongest pillar for supporting all BFI events held during the years. Slowly bridge started moving back to its live activities and online presence still dominated for the entire year as many players found new arenas to enjoy the game through various online programs.

We are grateful to all our members, sponsors as well the players who have been able to fight this precarious situation and have been actively supporting the game through various activities held.

While the pandemic was slowly diminishing with proper safety measures, the federation felt the severity of the damage the virus will cause to the revival of live activities and hence it was imminent to plan national tournaments with a pinch of caution and various safety measures were ensured in all BFI tournaments held during the year to protect our players from any infection. Additionally, BFI has always been a frontrunner to undertake several bridge ventures which have been unfeasible for other organizers on account of its dedicated workforce and technical expertise.

The process to conduct online tournaments started with official agreement with BBO was completed in 2022 as per the agreement which was successfully led to India being part of the BBO Virtual clubs and Indian TDs were officially invited to undertake small to medium sized weekly events for their regional players. However, BBO continued to identify our Indian organizers to allow them to run their tournaments independently.

As part of our annual Indian Bridge Calendar, the major national level events were successfully held which had a slow turnout to start with as expectedly starting with Tolani Summer Nationals 2022 at Bengaluru. The other major events held were:

BFI is also proud to announce that lockdown has resulted in the growth of its player's size and the online registrations of new players had witnessed a record peak from several areas. Also, the federation through the efforts of the its technical team has successfully cleansed the player's database with more accurate data of active bridge players registered under the BFI Masterpoint scheme. The current database stands at 4300 odd players which is the highest in our zone as well among the top 10 members of WBF. We look forward to expand this family as well appreciate the efforts taken by our technical members.

BFI is thankful to all its generous sponsors who have given their support in spite of the financial setbacks due to COVID, by which our BFI has been able to provide the Indian players the same environment to compete and enjoy the game.

Along with joy comes sorrow as I deeply express my condolences to the bereaved families of our Indian bridge fraternity who were victims of this deadly virus. One of legendary players, Mr. Prakash Kejriwal, Mr. NK

Gupta, Mr Parasrampuria, Mr. Govindachari, Mr. MK Choudhary, Mr. Ravindra Bhave, Mr. Paresh Gupta, Mr. Gautam Mukherjee from Kolkata and several others who have been part of our family.

BFI has continuously endeavored to provide a significant improvement in terms of the activities conducted domestically and internationally for the promotion of the players and sport. Under the dignified guidance of our esteemed President, our federation is now strongly working towards the preparation of the teams towards the Asian Games 2022

It has been a success for our Indian Juniors Teams to secure medals at various international events and I am sure that the current exposure will give them the necessary practice to sharpen their skills and excel further in the future events. We are quite positive towards the aspiring juniors who are not far away from brining laurels to the country in the near future with the aid of our Junior Development and Training program and have been actively playing in various competitions

On the domestic front, the momentum of the live tournaments has been moving slowly as anticipated The mechanisms of the online events had been a suitable temporary solution for conducting events which will be now perhaps been more useful towards the educational programs as currently used by our teaching arm "Bridge Pathshala". I urge all the players to spread this awareness of bridge education through our official established channels and renowned panel of teachers who have vast experience in this field.

In addition, the federation had conducted online director workshops for training the directors with the current bridge laws as well inviting new aspirants to take training in this lockdown period. In the current year, we have been grateful to Shree Cement Ltd and West Bengal Association for holding the Tournament Director Seminar from 11 AM on 14th and 15th November at Calcutta Bridge Club. Late Mr. Ajay Brahmachari, Mr. Sudhir Aggarwal and Mr. Sanjay Chakraborty conducted the said seminar and issue merit certificates to all participants. All arrangements were nicely done by West Bengal Association under the guidance of Mr Debasish Ray.

BFI has successfully introduced the **Masterpoint Scheme** (revised 2020) which has resulted in more systematic process of recording masterpoints and easy new player's registration process directly through the BFI website.

The federation has also actively planned the framework for its preparations to the next Asian Games with Sports Authority of India thereby designing its Annual Competition events to formulate a proper process to evaluate the athletes as per the SAI recommendations. In the current year, as the live events are underway, the federation has implemented three coaching camps for the Men, Mixed and Women categories and for live coaching camps

Junior Camps:

- a) Junior Camp 28th April to 1st May
- b) Junior Camp 2nd to 6th June
- c) Junior Camp 30th Dec to 2nd Jan

Senior Camps:

- a) Women Camp 2nd to 6th May
- b) Men/Mixed/Women 11 to 19th May
- c) Men/Mixed/Women 2 to11th March, 2023

Bridge Learning and Education Centre:

The federation had setup a bridge education center officially at **Mumbai** at **Lokmanya Seva Sangh** premises in year 2020. This center is fully operational and has generated a positive response thanks to the COVID

restrictions where many enrollments were seen for bridge game. We expect the Pathshala to enable these new aspirants as regulars in the near future for the expansion of our player force.

BFI is hopeful of establishing more such centers all over India in the years to come.

During the 15 months, BP has conducted 117 offerings of the courses and they have been attended by over1,400 students – some students have attended multiple offering of the same course on different topic. The overall feedback on course quality has been excellent as students keep coming back to our courses on different topics. BP has been able to get more than 150 newcomers to learn the game.

CSR Sponsorships:

BFI immensely expresses its gratitude to all the sponsors who have generously contributed towards the bridge education and training programs. Bridge being a national priority sport game recognized by Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs has been eligible for CSR contributions which has been used for promotion of juniors and education teaching programs.

Ranking Policy:

The ranking policy of the federation in the final year of its cycle and based on the completion of the ranking events scheduled to be completed this year, the selection trials will be proposed to be implemented from March, 2023 onwards with a suitable point allocation scheme as proposed by the BFI Ranking Committee. Also, the carryover percentage of the points for past years will determined by the Ranking Committee.

Elections:

Regarding the office matters, the **elections for BFI Executive Committee** were held at **PYC Gymkhana, Pune on 16**th **September, 2022** followed by **Annual General Meeting** under the guidelines given by Ministry of Youth and Sports Affairs. The Returning Officer was R Venkatesh.

The new term for the office bearers will be from 2022-26 as per the National Sports Code, 2011 subject to attainment of age of 70. In addition, all state associations have been bifurcated under Permanent and Temporary Members on the basis of their compliance with the National Sports Code, 2011. We have requested all state associations to submit their AGM copies as well have district associations of minimum 50% as part of mandatory compliance of the National Sports Code, 2011.

Finally, I would express my deep gratitude to the past committee especially led by **Mr. S Sunderasan** and **Mr. K.S. Samant** who have been instrumental in these tough times to lead and support the federation and have helped tremendously towards the development of the game.



Federation and National Level Competitions:

The Indian Bridge Calendar consists of various categories of tournaments held every year across India through our member state associations and affiliates. The federation has classified these tournaments in the four major categories:

1) Federation Tournaments: These events will be organized by the federation on a national scale open for all players (except for national masters) as a qualifying event to earn a berth for the selection trials. These events hold the highest federation points to be awarded to all deserving candidates. Meritorious candidates are selected to represent at the Selection Trials for representing India in the world level competitions. These events have the maximum participation from all the affiliated states and bodies.

The following events are classified as FEDERATION events:

- a) Summer Nationals (June July)
- b) Interstate Bridge Senior and Juniors Championships (August September)
- c) National Masters (October November)
- d) Winter Nationals (December)
- e) Selection Trials based on the World event schedule
- f) National Mixed Championships (Nov)
- 2) National Tournaments: These tournaments are classified as "NATIONAL" status having the entire technical and manpower infrastructure similar to the federation event but organized by external bodies such as corporate sponsors, clubs, state associations etc under the aegis of the federation. There is a capitation fee to be paid to attain the status of national event. These events also carry sizable federation points to be awarded to merit holders.

Since past many years as Bridge had attained a PRIORITY status recognized by Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs. As a result, SAI had given due recognition to our national event "Interstate Bridge Championships" for Seniors(Men & Women), Juniors and Sub Juniors Categories as part of their program.

With the current achievement at the Asian Games, Bridge Federation of India has been actively working with SAI for preparing the athletes under their guidelines through the medium of coaching camps and national competitions.

In the current year, the federation had conducted Six Coaching camps for the Seniors (Men, Mixed, Women) and Juniors(U31,U26,U21,U16) categories.

The Bridge Federation of India announced its team that will represent India at the at the forthcoming Asian Games in Hangzhou, China from 23 Sep to 08 Oct 2023. After its annual coaching camp and selection trials held at the idyllic settings of Shiv Nadar Institution of Eminence, Greater Noida from 02 – 18 March 2023 and conducted under the auspices of the Sports Authority of India, the selection of team was undertaken in 4 categories (only 3 for Asian games).

The camp was conducted in 3 phases with the Men's/ Open team preparation in Phase 1 between 02-07 March, followed by the Mixed team in phase 2 from 10-14 March, and the Ladies and the Senior team in the third Phase between 15-17 March.

This team will also expect to represent India at the World Team Championships in Morocco in August this year. Contract bridge is one of the most popular mind-sport in the world and is a Priority Sports under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. It was introduced at the Asian Games in Jakarta in 2018 where a good harvest of 01 Gold and 02 Bronze medals were reaped. Despite the fact that the number of events has been reduced from 6 to 3 this year, the team is looking forward to surpass its medal tally this year. The composition of team is as under: -
