Stellar Success at the 21st HCL International Bridge Championship

The 21st HCL International Bridge Championship, held from 14th to 22nd September 2024 at The Leela Ambience Convention Hotel, New Delhi, was an overwhelming success. A key feature of the global bridge calendar, the Gold Teams event was part of the prestigious World Bridge Tour, attracting top teams from around the globe, including USA, Poland, Russia, Israel, Italy, Norway, UK, Australia, New Zealand, Kenya, Sri Lanka, and Bangladesh etc..

The championship witnessed participation from 51 teams in the Gold section and 92 teams across the silver categories. The organization of the event was impeccable, earning widespread praise for its excellent game quality, superior hospitality, and luxurious ambience. Players and attendees alike hailed it as one of the best-organized bridge tournaments in recent years.

Team WHAM (Sartaj Hans, Andy Hung, Michael Whibley, and Matthew Brown from Australia and New Zealand) defeated Shourie (Rajath Shourie, Gavin Wolpert, John Kranyak, Vincent Demuy, Kevin Bathurst, and John Hurd from USA) in a close math in the GOLD category of the Team of four event to lift the Naresh Tandan Trophy. First, third, and fourth sessions were tight, with IMP scores 40-35, 25-28, and 23-25 for Shourie. WHAM won the third session 29-4. That difference was enough to overcome the carry-over score of six IMPs Shourie started with. WHAM eventually won by 117-98 IMPs.

Mohini Tandan Trophy for Team of Four SILVER category was lifted by RSCS (Ramprosad Das, Subrata Chakraborty, Sanjay Raha, Chandan Choudhury). They beat Jackalls (D.P.Acharya, Shubham Acharya, Mridul Das, Nukesh Ghatia, Shubhrajit Mukhopadhyay, Hemant Kumar Sarma) by 119-84.6 IMPs. In the play-off for third position, Sahyadri defeated Sabass 77-58 1MPs.

S. Sunderram and P.Shridharan clinched the Neena Banerjee Trophy when they won the Match-Point GOLD Pairs final with a score of 63.21%. Binod Kumar Shaw and Sanjit Dey were the runners-up with a score of 58.38%. Marianne Karmarkar and Sandeep Karmarkar were third with 56.37%.











The HCL International Bridge Championship continues to raise the bar, solidifying its status as a premier event on the global bridge scene.

Team India Set for Glory at the 16th World Bridge Games in Buenos Aires

The Mixed category will see Kiran Nadar & Bachiraju Satyanarayana, Rajeev Khandelwal & Himani Khandelwal, and T V Ramani & Bindiya Kohli competing. In the Women's category, Puja Batra & Asha Sharma, Alka M Kshirsagar & Bharti Dey, and Alka Jain & Devi Muthu Bhatnagar will represent India. The Senior category features Ravi Goenka, Arun Bapat, Kamal Mukherjee, Badal Das, Pranab Bardhan, and Vibhas Todi.


